PASSED IN THE FIFTH SESSION OF THE SIXTH PROVINCIAL PARLIAMENT OF UPPER-CANADA,
MET AT YORK, ON THE SIXTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, IN THE FIFTY SIXTH YEAR OF THE REIGN
OF OUR SOVEREIGN LORD GEORGE THE THIRD, AND PROROGUED ON THE FIRST DAY OF APRIL
FOLLOWING.

CHAP. I.

*An Act to alter the time of holding the Courts of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace,
in the London and Johnstown Districts of this Province.*

[Passed 22d March, 1816.]

WHEREAS the Provisions of an Act of the Parliament of this Province, pass-
ed in the Forty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, "an Act to re-
move doubts with respect to the Authority under which the Courts of General Quar-
ter Sessions of the Peace and other Courts, have been erected and holden; And other
matters relating to the administration of Justice, done in the several Districts of this
Province; And also to fix the times of holding the Courts of General Quarter
Sessions of the Peace in and for the same," have not been found generally benefi-
cial; BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice
and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper
Canada, constituted and assembled, by virtue of, and under the authority of an
Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "an Act to repeal certain
parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "an
Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Que-
bec in North America, and to make further Provision for the Government of the
said Province," and by the authority of the same, That so much of the second
clause, of the said Act, as enacts that the said Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace, for the District of London shall be holden, on the second Tuesday
in the months of March, June, September and December, and for the District of
