IX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Honorable William Allan, William Thompson, and Grant Powell, Esquires, be Commissioners for the purpose of receiving Plans and Estimates, and of Commissioners ap-Contracting for and Superintending the Erection of the said Buildings, pointed for superinto which said Commissioners the sums required to be expended for the of the said Buildingse purposes of this Act shall be paid in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as shall be issued for that purpose by the Governor, Lieutenant Governmer, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, and that the sums so applied shall be accounted for to His Majesty, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously plea. sed to direct, and that an account of such expenditure shall, from time to time, be laid before the Legislature of this Province ; Provided, always nevertheless, that if any of the said Commissioners shall die, or shall decline to act as Commissioner under this Act, it shall be in the power of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Govern-Vacancies, how supment of this Province to appoint a Commissioner or Commissioners in view the room of any one or more of such Commissioners as shall die or refuse to act as aforesaid.
