Largest Oil Tanker Afloat.

The world's largest oil tank steamer the San Fratello, of 15,500 tons, was successfully launched on February 22nd, from the slipway of Messrs Swain, Hunter & Wigham Richardson on the River Tyne. The San Fratello is the first of 19 oil vessels that are being built for the Eagle Oil Transport Company, which is a subsidiary of the Maritime Oil Company both companies controlled by Lord Cowdray. The steel hull of the San Fratello contains twelve holds separated by longitudinal bulkheads into 24 compartments, and these will be invariably filled with oil on the way from Mexico. But the boat carries in addition many of the luxuries of a passenger ship. There is accommodation for a limited number of passengers, a separate mess room for the crew, a hospital, operating room for the wireless, telegraphy equipment, and cold storage for food-stuffs. The pumping room contains machinery capable of pumping 1,200 tons of oil per hour, and each oil compartment is fitted with steam heaters to facilitate the pumping of the heavy oil. Her length over all is 548 feet, and her moulded depth to shelter deck 41 1/2 feet. Ex
