OTTAWA, November 8 — Dealers who have advanced the price of sugar to their customers during the past month, are taking an improper advantage of the present temporary shortage and exacting an unfair profit. Such is the effect of a statement issued last night by the food controller, Mr. Hanna added that there was no excuse for retail prices today being higher than they were a month or six-weeks ago. He pointed out that for the month of September the prices of sugar in all parts of Canada were between ten and eleven cents per pound.

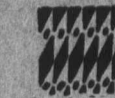
