This makes the fourth victim among those who attended the affair. While it was thought at first that the deaths were due to ptomaine poisoning from eating gelatined chicken, it is now believed that they were due to typhoid fever, which resulted from drinking impure water. Mrs. S. A. Laldman and Mrs. Laidman are also very ill, but it is believed that they will recover.

Failing in this, Griffin ran to the fire hall tring the bell but missed his way and smashed the wrong window, injuring himself.
