Winnipeg—The cash grain depart-
ments were again quiet and lifeless to-
day with only a light volume of busi-
ness being transacted.
The demand for cash oats was very
light and the spreads were unchanged
from the past few days.
For cash barley there was an im-
proved inquiry for the lower grades
with offerings only of a fair volume.
There was little doing in cash flax.
Oats closed unchanged for May and
1/4c higher for July.
Barley closed unchanged for May.
Flax closed 3/4c higher for May and
1/4c higher for July.

NEW TOP PRICES

FOR BEEF CATTLE
Some Extra Good Stuff Sold for \$15.35;
Full Load Sold for \$15; Hogs
Were Strong

Prices were exceptionally good at
the local stockyards Thursday. A
new top price was made in beef cattle,
a few extra quality steers being sold
by the United Grain Growers at \$15.35.
A full load was sold by another firm
at \$15. A few fat cows were sold at
\$13.25.

About five loads of cattle appeared
on the market during the day, but very
little of it was of extra quality. Most
of it sold from \$12.50 to \$14. Hogs
sold from \$20.25 to \$20.35. Only about
300 changed hands during the day.

UNITED GRAIN GROWERS' LIVE- STOCK BULLETIN

Receipts
Last week's Alberta stockyards re-
ceipts: Horses, 462; cattle, 1,531;
hogs, 2,452; sheep, 834.

This week's receipts: Horses, 380;
cattle, 1,972; hogs, 2,187; sheep, 251.
Corresponding week a year ago:
Horses, 385; cattle, 775; hogs, 1,974;
sheep, 185.

Cattle: The week's run of cattle
turned out to be mostly stockers and
very little good butcher stuff was on
sale. We sold a few good steers for
Mr. Wilson of Iricana, at \$14.50 and
this was practically the top of the
market, but the bulk of the steers
offered were not good enough to real-
ize over \$13.75. We quote choice
grain-fed steers \$13.75 to \$14.50; med-
ium to good steers \$12 to \$13.75 and
common killers from \$12 to \$13. Fat
cows and heifers were in strong de-
mand and we sold our best stuff from
\$12.50 to \$13 with medium cows \$10.50
to \$13 and common from \$8.50 to \$10.
Bulls sold about the same as last
week with the best bringing from \$9
to \$10. No oxen were offered, but the
good ones would sell readily at high
prices. Veal calves are worth from
\$11 to \$12. The trade in stocker
steers was brisk and a considerable

number changed hands at from \$9.75
to \$10.35 with yearling steers and
heifers of good quality from \$45 to
\$52.50 and common stuff \$5 lower. A
number of thin stocker cows found a
purchaser at from \$60 to \$70, but well
bred cows in good condition will real-
ize more, although the demand is not
very brisk.

Top price on cattle a year ago \$11.
Hogs: There was no trading on
hogs until Thursday and with most of
the buyers keen after the good stuff,
prices strengthened and we sold out
hogs of that day at \$20.05, with a fair-
ly heavy run on Friday the market
held steady and \$20.05 was the pre-
vailing price.

Top price on hogs a year ago \$15.85.
Sheep: No fat sheep on sale. We
quote fat lambs and wethers at \$16 to
\$17 and fat ewes \$14 to \$15.

Judging from the receipts this week
it would appear as though the bulk of
the good beef has already been sold.
We are of the opinion that a few
loads of choice thick steers would
probably sell at even higher prices
than have yet been obtained, but it is
only a matter of a short time before
prices will begin to decline. Keep in
touch with us and get posted on all
matters appertaining to the disposal
of your livestock as the United Grain
Growers was organized for the bene-
