The concert will be under the direction of Professor Tanton, and is expected to be one of the best given in the city for some time.

H. M. S. MAORICHENSE has been ordered from the Cape and West coast of Africa to take the place of the Comus on the North American and West India Station. She is a twin screw third-class cruiser, bark rigged, with a steel hull sheathed with wood. The Magicienne was launched in 1888, has a gross of 2900 tons and is 305 feet in length. Her speed is 19 knots. Her armament consists of 6 6 inch R. B. L. guns, 5 tons each; 10 quick firing guns 3 machine guns and 6 torpedo launching tubes. She carries a crew of 232 men, and will be the swiftest cruiser on this station with the exception of the new flagship Blanche.
