Watford Board of Trade has received a communication from a Toronto manufacturing firm, who manufacture worsted and cashmere knit goods, sweaters, Jerseys, toques, underwear, etc. The firm is prepared to install a plant requiring about 40 hands to opperate it, mostly females, and additional machines later on if hands are available. Knitters are paid up to \$7 weekly, finishers \$1 less, hand sewers average the same. The inducements the firm expects are exemption from taxes, building at low rent, and a reasonable bonus.


Six New County Constables.
