CARADOC FARMER

KICKED BY HORSE

Was Badly Cut About the Face—
Presentation to a Popular
Teacher.

(Special to The Advertiser.)
Strathroy, Dec. 24.—While doing his
evening chores, Gurd, son of Wm.
Blair, residing on the 7th con. of
Caradoc was badly injured as the re-
sult of a kick from a colt. He was
badly cut about the cheek and nose,
