Boston, Mass., June 2.—Through the generosity of the Tigers, Boston was able to land the first game of the series between the two teams today by a score of 6 to 5. The champions had the game sewed up for seven innings. During six rounds they held the Red Sox scoreless, while they themselves were piling up a total of five runs. Then the Tiger balloon made an ascension, and when it came down to terra firma again Boston had just one more run than the visitors and the victory was theirs.

A Poor Game.
The game, which was Boston's first meeting with a western team on the home lot this year, was peculiar in many respects. It was featured by some sensational playing, mixed with numerous sand lot exhibitions in which both teams offended more or less. Errors were responsible for nearly all of the tallies, the wobbles on both sides coming just at critical moments, and tallies resulting from their occurrence.

Eddie Killian, Tiger veteran, twirled for the visitors. He faced Arrelanes at the start, but the champions' slugger drove the Mexican from the slab after the first inning and Charlie Check took his place.

Check was hit a little bit better than his predecessor. He was wild, very wild, and a fumble and a wild pitch by the twirler in the first inning in which he pitched tended to strengthen the champions' lead by netting the Tigers two more tallies, making their total four.

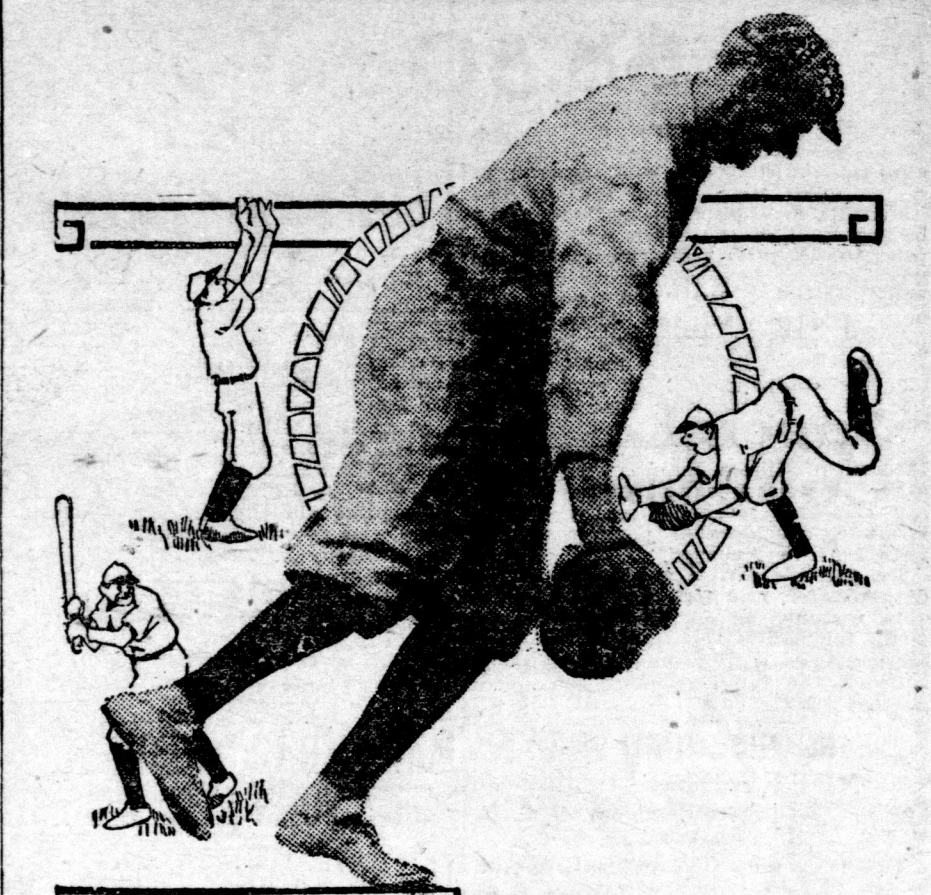
