THE PLANT WILL BE BUILT HERE. The Toronto Electric Light Company makes the assertion that if a civic lighting plant is decided upon the work of building that plant will be done in Chicago. There is no truth in the assertion.

The steam engines, boilers and poles will all be built in this province, and the building itself will, of course be put up all be built in this province, and the building itself will, of course, be put up by Toronto workmen. It is just possible the dynamos may be constructed on the other side, but we are not certain as to this, as we know that Canada is already producing as good dynamos as any other country. 
