

PETROLEA, Dec. 20. - Fifteen directors CAN YOU READ THIS 1 FT. AWAY P THE SHADES OF

PRTROLMA, Dec. 20. — Pifteen directors, representing every township in the Gounty of Lambton met in Petrolea to-day and made final arraugements for their corn show. It will be held in Vic-toria Hall, Petrolea, on January 28 and 29. This promises to be the largest agriculture event ever planned for the County of Lambton, and one which it is expected will open the eyes of the farm-ers in this county to the possibilities of the seed corn industry. The directors were especially well pleased with the hearty response to their requests for financial assistance by the ounty councils and the various town-ships. The Town of Petrolea has also granted the association material financial assistance. In all, about \$1,000 has been collected to defray the expenses of the sheen arranged and will go into the hands of the printers immediatey. The best men available will be secured to give instructions in corn growing. Good roads, hydro-electric for the farmer and better transportation fa-cilities for the County of Lambton will also be discussed. THE EYE MUSCLES
