The Official Bulletin.—Lose Blasen, Sept. 19, 11.50 p. m.—The following official bulletin has just been issued: "LAWSON, N. J., Sept. 19, 11.30 p. m.—The President died at 10 p. m. After the bulletins issued at 9.30, the President continued in much the same condition as during the afternoon, the pulse varying from 102 to 106 with rather increased force and quick sleep.

After the death of the President, the body was placed in a coffin and taken to the White House. The funeral will be held on Monday next.
