into the water, which must be boiling hot. As soon as this is dissolved, remove the solution from the fire and add the kerosene. At once agitate the material violently until a smooth, creamy emulsion is formed without any free oil. This is the stock solution and must be diluted with 12 to 15 parts of water before being applied to foliage.

Directions for making this material nust be adhered to closely, otherwise, burning may result. It is better to apply same on a sunny day. The foregoing applies to aphids found on potatoes, although the application must be made even more promptly than in the case of the
