A REVIEW OF PHILATELIC JOURNALS.

I will here attempt to review all the Philatelic Journals I have received since summer.

The *Collectors Standard* for August to hand, nearly all of its space is devoted to those Halifax Ferry Tokens.

The August number of Herdman's *Miscellany* (Eng.) is a neat 8 page, neatly printed monthly, most of its space is devoted to philately.

Who! The *Badger State* has come out with special edition, neatly printed over number 10. It contains a cover, a few A. P. A. notes, a lot of advertisements and is entered at Delavan, Wis. as second-class mail matter. The editor says "we wonder." So do I.

A very neat little journal from Springfield, Wis has appeared. It is a neat 8 page, and is well worthy of support.

The *Halifax Philatelist* for Sept. contains an advertisement of Wilson Wilby, some clippings from the *Philatelic Record*, and a C. P. A. ticket, and for a dollar; give us a little original matter for a change.

The *Quaker City Philatelist* for Sept. has an excellent article on that everlasting grinding saw "Rowland Hill invented the adhesive postage stamps."

The U. S. *Philatelist* has arrived safe and I notice that S. C. Scott has been slightly divided into a two. It is a good little paper just the same.

The best on the list is the *American Philatelist*. Sept. No. contained 43 pages and nearly all of it devoted to reading matter and first-class at that. It only costs half a dollar for a year.

The *Eastern Philatelist* for Sept. with almost a sheet iron cover and paper almost like shingles Candensis made a very good guess at what went on in Toronto at the C. P. A. convention.

A shanty on your eye oh! Well get J. J. Casey Esq. roused up again and pinch the boys a little so we will all know that you are sober again. The *Stamp Collectors Figaro* is published in Chicago, Ill.

The *Philatelic Beacon* has succeeded in getting out its first number. It contains some very valuable matter for collectors. Subscription price is 25 cents per year, and it is well worth it.

Charleston Philatelist for October contains a portrait of G. J. Luhn, I notice that he is the possessor of a pompador and all boys who use that instrument are considered smart. I guess it will fit well on Gus.

The first paper to come out with the C. P. A. convention report was the *Collectors Ledger*. It was reported by F. J. Grenny.

The old reliable *American Journal of Philately*, Oct., has been duly received. The looks of the cover is enough to tell what is inside. I notice something there which is new, Mayor Evans is a strong supporter of Sir Rowland Hill. That settles it.

The *Ontario Stamp Journal* seems to

want to fight at once. No. 1 is a very good number considering the price of subscription, 10 cents per year.
