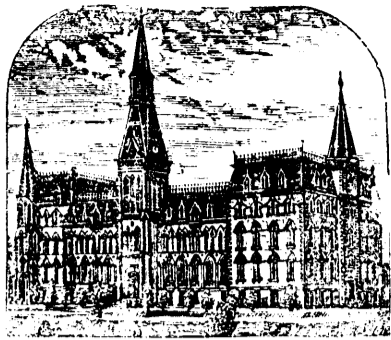
At Cobourg, on July 9th, the wife of Mr. J. Henderson, Bank of Toronto, of a daughter.

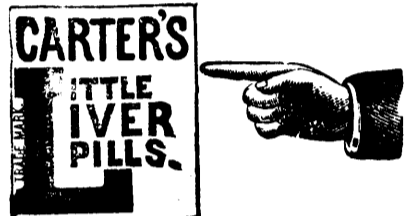
