QUESTION:

I am not saying fully informed, I was referring to appreciation. You in your speech yesterday in Parliament said there was a lot to be said for America, or words to that effect, and you tried, shall we say, to interpret sympathetically to us the American view. We have a feeling that maybe we do not understand the American position and you were good enough to understand. Did you have any evidence in your talks with Mr. Nehru of that kind?

No, Mr. Nehru made no criticism whatsoever of the views I had expressed as formed from our experience living alongside our American neighbours. There are, I suppose, 160 million people in the United States. I don't know so much about Asia but I do know that there were impressions that were not fair to the mass there are such impressions in Asia or not, but I had a lot to do with Americans who were making investment and contacts with many Americans and I have had quite extensively throughout the United States, and I very much different output and the united States citizen is not living alongside our American neighbours. There are, think that in the main the United States, and very much different from the United States citizen is not wants peace. he wants need to the Canadian citizen. He wants peace; he wants to raise his family under peaceful conditions and he is willing to go along they are going to heat sections for him that peace they are going to best secure for him that peace for himself and his family that he hungers for. two or three of

QUESTION:

How is it that the United States is deliberately creating tension in this part of the world by giving military aid to Pakistan?

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ANSWER:

tension. I know that their deliberately creating to lessen tension. Now, after the Coronation I had some chats with Mr. Malik, who was the Russian during the ceremony to be seated, well, no further representative at the Coronation, and who happened during the ceremony to be seated, well, no further the stall, choir stall, along the wall and my wife and he followed the Coronation ceremony with whether he would or not and then I had several him my satisfaction that Russia was going to resume him my satisfaction that Russia was going to normal diplomatic relations with us and send an Ambassador back to Ottawa. There had not been little trouble over a spy investigation and I an Ambassador there since 1945 after we had some little trouble over a spy investigation, and I said that I hoped we would certainly follow their and that I hoped that would help do something toward easing the situation. And I said, of source I suppose we will continue doing things you think are wrong and I know that you are going to continue doing things we think are wrong, but I hope you won't think we are doing it on purpose and that we will be charitable enought not to think you are doing it on purpose. He said, well you know
