DECLARATIONS ON NON-APPLICATION

The following declarations apply to Canada's acceptance of the Agreement on Government Procurement with respect to the European Economic Community:

- (a) The Department of the Post Office is included in the Canadian list of entities on the understanding that, should it cease to be a government department, the provisions of Article IX, paragraph 5(b) of the Agreement on Government Procurement would not apply. The Government of Canada does not, therefore, accept the declarations of the European Economic Community concerning the Canadian Post Office.
- (b) The Government of Canada will apply the Agreement to the European Economic Community on a provisional basis until such time as the European Economic Community applies the Agreement definitively with respect to Canada.

DECLARATIONS UNDER ARTICLE IX, PARAGRAPH 5(b)

The Department of the Post Office is included in the Canadian list of entities on the understanding that, should it cease to be a government department, the provisions of Article IX, paragraph 5(b) of the Agreement on Government Procurement would not apply.
