A Word of Caution

Some readers may feel uncomfortable with some aspects of the guide, such as the way we have portrayed the foreign advisor in the scenario below. The discomfort is normal and healthy, likely a sign that the reader has already begun to develop an awareness of sensitive situations within the new environment. Although our characterizations are typical of many, they are by no means universal.
