THIS IS A VERY SPECIAL OCCASION FOR US
IN CANADA. IT IS LESS A STATE OCCASION THAN A REUNION
OF FRIENDS AND NEIGHBOURS. SINCE I BECAME SECRETARY
OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS TWO YEARS AGO, I HAVE
BEEN IMPRESSED BY THE UNIQUE CHARACTER OF RELATIONS
BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES. WE ARE TWO
YOUNG NATIONS WHICH GREW UP IN A NEW WORLD, WHOSE
POPULATIONS ARE MADE UP OF PEOPLE FROM A MULTITUDE
OF NATIONS AND CIVILIZATIONS FROM DIFFERENT PARTS OF
THE WORLD. WE SPEAK A COMMON IDIOM IN NORTH AMERICA —
EVEN THOUGH IN CANADA WE DO IT IN TWO LANGUAGES —
AND UNDERSTAND EACH OTHER PERHAPS BETTER THAN ANY OTHER
TWO COMPARABLE NATIONS IN THE WORLD. THIS UNDERSTANDING
AND WILLINGNESS TO SEE THE OTHER'S POINT OF VIEW HAS
ENABLED US TO ACHIEVE SOME EXEMPLARY FORMS OF COOPERATION.
