# SEARCH AND RESCUE

## Question No. 541-Mr. McKinnon:

Did the Department of National Defence issue a press release on December 3, 1976, saying *inter alia* "... the measures to improve Search and Rescue facilities will cost approximately \$8 million initially; and, with full implementation in two to three years, could cost as much as \$40 million" and, if so, what amount of the \$40 million has been spent and for what major items?

2. How much was spent on each coast?

Hon. Barney Danson (Minister of National Defence): 1. Yes. The total program for both coasts will cost \$36.94 million, which includes \$1.58 million for construction at Gander, Newfoundland.

The program is divided into two phases.

Phase I will provide improved navigation and radio aids and the addition of Night Sun Searchlight to helicopters at a cost of \$8.63 million.

Phase II will provide extended range, an improved rescue hoist and an improved night/adverse weather capability at a cost of \$26.73 million.

Phase I will be completed in January, 1979 and Phase II will then commence with completion targeted for late 1982.

2. Due to the interrelationship of phase I and phase II and the requirement to rotate helicopters through each phase, actual funds spent at each coast are difficult to delineate. However, when the program is completed funds spent will total as follows:
