- (i) for any purpose to which neither Rule 44 nor Rule 46 applies.
- (2) Where a senator wishes to correct irregularities or mistakes in an order, resolution, or other vote of the Senate, he shall give one day's notice, and a correction shall not be made unless at least two-thirds of the senators present vote in favour of such correction.

Motions for which no notice required

- 46. No notice is required of the following motions:
- (a) by way of amendment to a question;
- (b) for the referral of the question to a committee;
- (c) for its postponement to a certain day;
- (d) for the previous question;
- (e) for reading the Orders of the Day;
- (f) for the adjournment of the Senate, while a matter is under discussion;
- (g) for the adjournment of the Senate for the purposes of raising a matter of urgent public importance (which the mover shall state on rising to speak) before the House proceeds to the Orders of the Day;
- (h) for the adjournment of the debate;
- (i) for the consideration forthwith or on a future day of Commons amendments to a public bill;
- (j) for the appointment of a committee to prepare reasons for disagreeing with a Commons amendment;
- (k) raising a question of privilege;
- (l) for the first reading of a bill;
- (m) for the postponement, discharge or revival of an order of the day;
- (n) for dealing on a future day with any matter which is on the Table of the Senate;
