increase the number from three to five.

We had a meeting of the Liberal Executive a week ago tonight, and incidentally I told them in addressing them that I had been Acting Secretary for the past six or seven years and had never asked any fovour of them. I had given my time and money in the last few elections held here for both Dominion and Local Houses, and the thought struck me that it would not cost anything to ask the government to appoint me on the Commission.

The resolution was passed unanimously and forwarded to Ir. King, signed by one as Acting Secretary for the evening. I got Mr. I. L. Matthews, the defeated Candidate in the last general election to write personally to the Prime Minister, also Mr. A. J. McComber, the previous defeated candidate, also Mr. J. W. Crooks, ex-Mayor, member of the Liberal Executive, and Dr. Geo. E. Eakins, President of the Liberal Association here, and now I go to you and ask if at all possible, to write a letter to the Prime Minister confidentially. I think that your letter will have as much weight, if not more, than all the rest combined.

This position, as you know, carries a salary of \$6,000 a year with it, and that will just suit me fine.

I pointed out to the Prime Minister all my bad qualities, such as working in the Post Office at Strathroy for 21 years, and for the past 16 years have been in the
