Dear Sir Arthur:

I forward for your inspection the application form of Mr. R.R. Thompson, which was duly signed by Professors Conklin, Gray, Murray, and Thomson. Knowing that his subjects were Bacteriology and Biochemistry, I asked the Professors of those subjects to attend, namely, Murray, Gray, Collip, Thomson, and some others.
