COOKSHIRE.

During the past year the services have been well attended. A Sunday School is efficiently taught. A Sunday School Library and Hymnals have been procured. \$250 of the Church debt has been paid off. Amount raised over last year, \$125.50.

DURHAM.

The financial statement of the year shows an increase of \$71.60, and a total of \$1,003.71, and represents a contribution from each station to ten objects outside the Mission. A parsonage house has been built during the year and \$350 of the debt paid off. From the Report it may be gathered that the general aspect of the Mission is that of prosperity.
