#### Noodles.

E are fond of noodles at our house and often have noodle soup in coel weather, but I never heard of baking noodles until the other day when I saw 'breast of veal with baked noodles' on a menu card in a tea room. What can you tell me about this combination and is it a good home dish?" writes one of my readers.

Noodles in all forms are very satisfying and especially so when they are made at home with plenty of egg yolks and rick stock. "Baked noodles" is a rather westlying term but one that is easily however.

You will need rolling pin, pastry board, salt, flour, eggs and a very little cream. Three egg yolks will make sufficient paste to furnish a family of five with enough noodles for two dinners. Separate the eggs, and to every yolk used add a half an egg shell filled with cream or rich milk. Water may be used, but cream is much better. Beat a little with a fork and commence adding sifted flour, then a little salt. Add enough flour to make a stiff paste, but not enough to make it hard.
