Estimate of Huge Yield Caused Heavy Tone at Chicago.

CHICAGO, May 1.—Estimates that 3,000,000 more acres of wheat would be arvested in the United States this rear than ever before, smashed values oday, for new crop months. May conracts, however, were in strong hands, and scored a net gain. The market as a thole finished weak at a range varying from 5-8c to 3-4c decline to 3-8c dwance. Corn, too, closed irregular, 3-8c down to 1-4c up, oats unchanged to 1-4c lower, and provisions with a loss of 2½c to 17%c.

Extreme weakness which developed in distant futures of wheat came after they had bulged in sympathy with a sharp upturh for May. Deliveries here on options for the current month turned out to be only about half as much in volume as expected, and for the most part had gone into the possession of one of the houses credited with the heaviest financial backing on change. The consequent relative tightness in regard to May contracts was in evidence thruout the session, altho the price for that month receded to a material extent after the new crop month fell under bearish control.

Much the same situation came about

in corn as in wheat. The May deliveries of corn altho heavy passed into strong hands, but deferred futures were under decided selling pressure from bears. Shipments from Argentina exceeded what had been looked for

Oats ruled comparatively firm, as appears received most of the May liveries and were expected to dim-Provisions eased off on account of oading by packers. Steadiness in hog market helped to prevent a ore serious decline.


