WINNIPEG RECEIPTS

Offerings Are Heavy and Cash Trade in All Lines Discouraging.

WINNIPEG, Man., Oct. 29.—Wheat prices opened 1-2c lower to 1-2c higher. Oats were unchanged to 1-8c higher, and flax 1-4c to 5-8c higher, following the opening there was a sharp break to the extent of 5-8c on No. 4, and 1 3-8c on other months, caused by heavy selling in Chicago and Minneapolis, and heavy primary movement.

The cash trade in all lines is discouraging, offerings are heavy, farmers are more inclined to sell, and the demand is off for all nearby stuff. demand is off for all nearby stuff. Exporters on the break are buying futures in view of future sales.

Local receipts, while not heavy, are improving; 375 cars inspected yesterday as against 1300 cars last year, and in sight were 360 cars. The decline at noon was 1-2c to 1 3-8c from opening points. Later it was claimed considerable export sales had been worked on the break, one firm doing around 150,000 bushels, and other houses a similar quantity. Flax options made a gain of two cents to 7 1-8c, which is a feature, prices in this commodity having been on the down trend for some weeks.


