A reissue of Henry Clay Lewis's "Odd Leaves from the Life of a Louisiana 'Swamp
Doctor,'" [cop. 1843], published under the same pseudonym, and John S. Robb's
"Streaks of Squatter Life, and Far-West Scenes," our no. 71729, vol. 17, each work
having its original title.

Remainders of different issues of "Odd Leaves" and "Streaks of Squatter Life" were
bound together to make up the copies of The Swamp Doctor's Adventures. This is shown
by the two NYP. copies of that work, the imprints of "Odd Leaves" varying slightly,
and the "Streaks of Squatter Life" having different copyright dates.

Beside the undated issue of "Odd Leaves" with the copyright date 1843, there is
another undated issue copyrighted in 1846, found separately, NYP.; also editions of
1850, BM., c.; and 1852, c. They were all published under the pseudonym of Madison
Tensas.
