Condemned on Every Hand the More It is Studied.

The inmates of the Parliament Buildings wore an air of suppressed-very much suppressed-indignation yesterday. Plans for the summer have been knocked on the head and all on account of the strange order for the Legislature to meet on Aug. 3. This feeling is not confined to the city, for those who have got away will have to all rally round the standard, probably more for the sake of the rally than any work they will do.
