ANNUAL MEETING.

The sixty-sixth Annual Meeting of the Shareholders of this Company was held at its offices in this city at noon on Friday last, the 22nd inst.

ANNUAL REPORT.

The Directors have pleasure in presenting the sixty-sixth Annual Report, embracing the Financial Statements of the Company to the 31st December, 1899.

There has been a satisfactory growth in the premium income for the year in both the fire and marine branches. The Canadian fire business has shown exceptionally favorable results and there has been a moderate profit on the marine business written during the year.

The net profit on the year's transactions (\$62,038.89), has been sufficient to pay the usual half-yearly dividends at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum, and, after writing off an amount to cover depreciation in office furniture and securities, to provide for an addition of nearly \$7000 to the Reserve Fund, which now amounts to \$577,687.04.

The President, in moving the adoption of the report, said that it was gratifying to be able to refer to the satisfactory growth during the year in the income of the Company, which, after deducting amounts paid for reinsurance, showed net premium receipts of upwards of one and a half million dollars.

The Report was adopted, and a by-law was passed providing for an increase of capital stock of the Company to one million dollars, by the allotment of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars new stock to shareholders in the proportion of one share to every three shares held by them.
