THE GAS STOCK BYLAW

Today the citizens of Toronto are called on to vote for or against a by-law enabling the city to purchase stock in the Consumers Gas Company. How closely the proposal touches the company may be seen by the fact that the city is making to secure its defeat. In this we believe it will be wholly unsuccessful.

What are these benefits? There are in Britain 256 publicly owned gas plants earning on an average 6.12 per cent. on the capital invested, against 5.4 per cent. earned by privately owned plants.

These low rates are not due to the cheaper price of oil and coal, which cost much more in Scotland than in any part of the United States or Canada. This statement is made by the special commissioner of the Chicago Record-Herald, who made a thorough investigation into the results of municipal ownership in Britain.
