SEVEN MEASURES TO SUPPRESS VIOLENCE IN BROOKLYN.

Brooklyn, Jan. 19.—The leaders of the railroad strike were holding a meeting at their headquarters late last night when information was received that the strikers were planning to call out the troops.

At 7 o'clock this morning nearly 3000 strikers of the National Brotherhood of Railway Employees were under arms in this city.

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CLARA FORD'S TRIAL TO GO ON

An Application for its Postponement Until the Spring Assizes Refused by Judge Street.

Clara Ford will be tried at the present session for the murder of Frank Westwood. The grand jury returned a true bill Saturday afternoon, and the accused girl was at once arraigned. She pleaded not guilty and her counsel, Mr. Murdoch, moved before Mr. Justice Street to have the trial postponed until the March assizes.

In support of the motion for postponement Mr. Murdoch filed an affidavit made by the prisoner, in which she pleaded that a fair trial was impossible under the present state of public feeling, and that a prejudiced jury could not be obtained.

His Lordship said the affidavit did not disclose any justification for postponement, and refused the request.

Mr. Justice MacMahon will on Monday fix the date of the trial.

HARLEY DAVIDSON WINS

He Captures the United States Quarter-Mile Skating Championship and First-Place Second in the Five-Mile.

Newburg, N. Y., Jan. 19.—At the national amateur skating races at this afternoon in the quarter-mile event, Johnson of Minnesota and James A. Donoghue of Newburg entered in the first trial heat. It was won by Johnson in 38 seconds.

In the second heat, Cliff Rudd, Minneapolis and Harley Davidson of Toronto started. Mosher of Fiskville was sick and did not enter. Davidson won in 40.8 seconds.

In the third heat, Bernard McPartlan, Verbank, Hudson, Clark of Fiskville and Joseph F. Donoghue of Newburg started. Donoghue won in 41.2 seconds.

In the final heat Joe Donoghue, Newburg and Davidson started. Johnson got the lead, Donoghue following closely. Davidson pretty well in the rear, about half way down the track. Donoghue and Johnson got mixed up, Johnson fell, and Donoghue got his stroke, but was galloped his balance. Davidson went to the front and won, finishing in 37.2 seconds.

Donoghue was about 15 feet behind at the finish. Tom Eck, manager for Johnson, claimed a foul, but expressed himself willing to abide by the decision of the referee. The referee decided that Davidson had won without any second. There is talk of Johnson and Johnson skating it off later on.

In the five-mile race the starters were Johnson, Davidson of Toronto, Charles Clark of Fiskville, McPartlan, James A. Donoghue of Newburg, and W. C. Clark of Fiskville. S. F. Phillips of New York E. Thorne of Newburg and W. C. Clark of Fiskville.
