All departments of the dry goods trade are feeling the stimulus of the excellent Ontario crops, and the brilliant prospects for a bumper harvest in the west. The fact that spring trade in general lines was not good, because of the lateness of seasonable weather, and the fact that prices have been ascending, have combined to limit stocks. This is another reason for expectation of a large trade this fall. While the high prices tend to limit first orders, they have the effect of making for caution in purchasing orders, so that travellers feel confident that larger orders will come in, for with good times retailers believe prices will be no deterrent to their customers, especially with all prices on a parity.

Probably no department is so much affected as millinery, in which the sales of what are to some extent luxuries chiefly suffer in bad times. This season the outlook is described as "grand," and a leading house reports that orders received from placing trips were the best the house has ever
