### SAY 600,000 GERMANS FELL IN VERDUN FIGHTS

French Authorities So Estimate the Killed and Wounded of Enemy There

Verdun, Aug. 28 (correspondence of The Associated Press).—The greatest battle ever fought, an eighteen-months' struggle for Verdun, which has been in progress since Feb. 21, 1916, has been a brilliant triumph for the French army. Today not only the famous city, but its outlying belt of forts are in the hands of the victorious French defenders, while the discomfited German assailants lie behind their shell-ripped lines, suffering severely from the hard blows they have received and unable to do anything more for the moment to retrieve their course of the incessant bombardments, and then once more covered by earth thrown up by other exploding projectiles.

The correspondent of The Associated Press had frequent evidence, while crossing the torn-up battlefield, of the temporary character of the graves, and the hills in the vicinity of the fortress no fewer than 600,000 Germans have fallen dead or wounded. Tens of thousands of their bodies were buried where they fell, only to be disinterred again by shells tearing up the ground in the course of the incessant bombardments.

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
