CAN HEAR THE BOOM OF
"EM 100 MILES AWAY
New French Guns at Work On
Western Front
Big Noise When They Began Smashing
German Intrenchments; Some Queer
Stories; Certain Paris Thoroughfares
Appear to Collect the Sound
(Toronto Star)

Paris, July 22.—We in Paris are not
deprived of the sensations of war and
battle. In 1870 we were besieged from
September to January, and ate rat
paties. Now we have enough to eat, later-
ly with good American granulated cane
sugar, which the government has
nearly every day—one one could actually
identify any sounds of day or night as
coming from the fighting front. Then,
not very long ago, a shock of sound in
a certain wind and mist began to be
heard by those who are sensitively alive
to the least noise.
It was not like the trial of hand
grenades or experimenting with new guns
and explosives near Paris. That is of
daily occurrence, and we have learned
to discriminate, as we would the burst-
ing of the pneumatic tire of an auto. It
was not the bursting of an explosive
body at all. It was a shock, usually a
series of shocks, breaking the air from
far away. Wide streets, bordered
with houses and trees, and opening
northward, seemed to furnish a
sound-collecting tunnel. There is such
a street beside the Luxembourg Garden.
At Neully the boulevard running past
the American Ambulance Hospital is
another. In the open space before the
church at the end of the latter a few
persons gathered when others were in-
vited to listen. Then M. Bigodran of
the Academy of Sciences and Bureau of
Longitudes and Astronomical Observa-
tory of Paris, also began listening and
posting others to listen. He has pre-
sented a summary report of it to the
Academy, and authentic particulars will
be published in due time for the high
priests of science to ponder. Meantime
we profane laymen are reassured in the
judgment we had already formed.
Heard Hundred Miles Away
It was my barrier in the city who first
drew my attention to these far-away
sounds which were not explosive bursts,
not like those we hear all day long from
trial sounds round about Paris. They
turn out to be really from the shocks
of heavy artillery discharging sixty to
a hundred miles away, and even more.
Worth all the science of the case is
the solace to Paris feeling. For these
big guns which are reporting thus big
Paris are French guns—the new big
