SEEKING TROUBLE IN MILK SUPPLY

The sub-committee of the board of health which is making investigations of the milk supply for the city, made the second of its unheralded tours of inspection yesterday. It is thought that it will take about four more tours to complete the survey of the situation and when the survey is completed the committee will submit the report of its findings to the board. The aim of the investigation is to locate the trouble in the milk supply for the city. Wholesale, retailer, producer and even consumer are all being subjected to the inspection of the committee.

TEN CASES OF GIN ADDED TO STORE

The local office of the chief prohibition inspector received by express yesterday from Inspector W. G. Ashell, of Sussex, ten cases of John D. Kuyper gin which had been confiscated by the inspector because it was not addressed to any private dwelling or licensed vendor, as the provincial intoxicating liquor act provides. The six cases of Canadian-made whiskey, which were seized from a motor truck headed for the Maine border, were still at the office of the chief inspector's office.

The Lord Rector's Role

In 1860, when the students of Edinburgh University first enjoyed the privilege of electing a Lord Rector, Gladstone was returned by a large majority, and John Bigelow, the editor of the "New York Evening Post," who was then visiting England, went to Edinburgh to see the installation. "It became necessary to provide a robe for the new Lord Rector," Bigelow relates, "and the splendour and expense of this have been the subject of the most inflammatory gossip the last few days. It cost fifty guineas, to meet which expense each student was required to pay two shillings for his ticket. If the robe was too large for Gladstone (who in his prime stood 5 ft. 11 in., as he told Sir Algernon West) it will well suit another Mr. Lloyd George. But possibly the original robe has made way for a fresh one within the last sixty years."

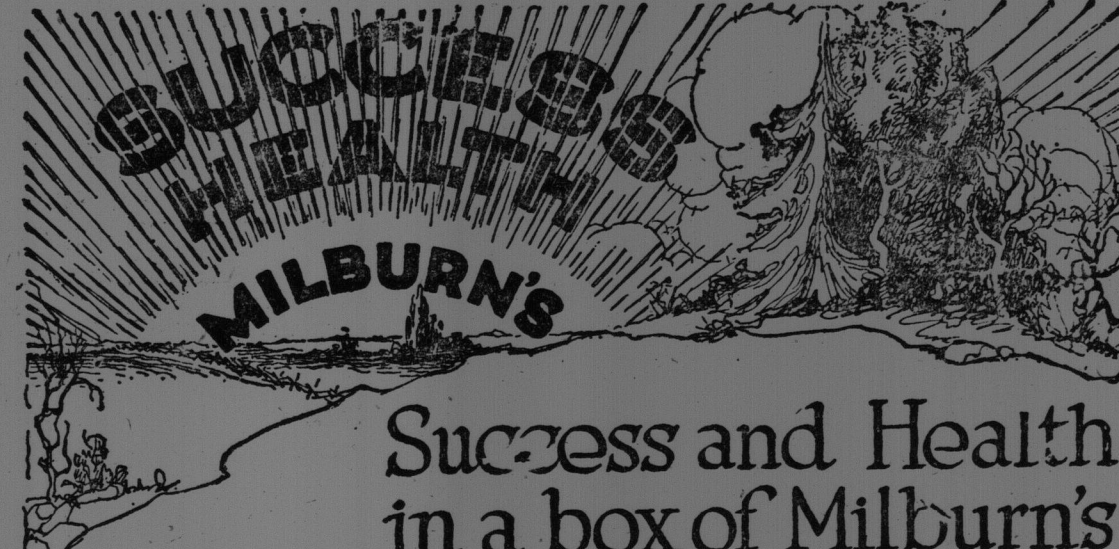
