FALLING PRICES

(Ottawa Journal.) In connection with reports that housekeepers have found little or no reduction recently in prices of food a prominent wholesale firm of Toronto sends to the Globe a statement showing the price charged by it on December 30 for staple groceries as compared with the prices it charged in July:

"You will see from this," writes the Toronto wholesale firm, "that there has been a considerable decline in the price of staple groceries" but remarks the Globe, "it is questionable whether housekeepers have received the full benefit of the decline. Consumers might satisfy themselves on this point by comparing the statement with the prices actually charged to them."

A drop in the wholesale price of any commodity is not always followed immediately by a drop in the retail price. Some time is requisite for the retailers change. A grocer who has ordered a stock of something from a wholesaler may have considerable of it remaining while the wholesale price is cut. The cut does not help the retailer; he still has to dispose of part of the goods bought at the previous higher wholesale price. This is the case with even the rapidly-selling goods of a grocer or fruiterer; it is far more the case with the goods of the departmental store or dealer in boots and shoes, and many other classes of retail business.

BUSINESS DROPS ON WESTERN RAILROADS

December Loadings Poorest in Recent Months—Economically Advised by Chief Executives. Chicago, Jan. 6.—Heavy losses in traffic necessitates economy in every branch of railroad operation, and this is being urged by leading traffic officials. There has been considerable retrenchment and more is expected. The Burlington and Pennsylvania Railroads continue to lay off men. In the Pullman shops 9,000 workers have offered to accept 20 per cent reduction in wages so that car building may be stimulated, yet railroads are not buying cars to any extent. No trouble is experienced in securing all the help for shop and general repairs, and there is less disposition on the part of the railroads to rush new work. All kinds of freight cars are being returned by the railroads to reduce expenditures, and most of them are under condition, so that there is plenty of room or repair work were the roads disposed to reduce the percentage of bad orders. A majority of the roads this is about normal, and ranges from 4 1/2 to 5 1/2 per cent. All roads are getting an increased car mileage per day, and in the latter is the best within a year.

The heavy reduction in traffic has more than offset the increased freight rates granted by the Interstate Commerce Commission. For the month of December freight loadings on the Illinois and Northwestern lost over 15 per cent, the Burlington almost 5 per cent, the Rock Island 7.5 per cent, and the Santa Fe 7 per cent. The St. Paul also shows a decrease.
