He compared the present government to the late member's obsequy given to the government and during his speech he pointed out the many instances of inconsistency and extravagance that he said he would find much trouble in answering.

It is well known that the late member's obsequy were hardly ever before instructions were given to issue the writ and it is fresh in the minds of the members that the proclamation throughout the country carried the news of the Conservative convention.

Mr. Burden, the Liberal candidate, is easily the most popular man in the county and will get a tremendous vote. Assurance of his success are on many lips tonight and York county will see the shortest and most active political battle in its history.
