ANOTHER NURSE HERE IS NEEDED

V. O. N. Superintendent Reports on Work in Saint John

Large Amount of Child Welfare Work Being Done Calls For More Help

Miss Mary L. Boswell, superintendent of the Victorian Order of Nurses for Eastern Canada, in reporting to the local V. O. N. board on the work of the nurses here recommended that the services of an additional nurse be secured because of the large amount of child welfare work done. She found that to date in 1925 the nurses had 460 babies on their register exclusive of babies in West Saint John, and had made 3,882 visits to infants.

The child welfare work, she said, was done in addition to the other duties of nursing the sick, and activities in connection with the prevention of disease and the promotion of health. The child welfare work involved the investigation of all deaths of infants under one year and the registering of all births that were not registered by some one else. All of this work was being carried out by the Victorian Order Nurses in the city as they, being in the field, had appeared to be the logical persons to do it. Their work, Miss Boswell said, was done in co-operation with the Board of Health.

BY DISTRICTS
She explained that the city was divided into districts and a nurse had charge of the work in her own district making it a far simpler matter for each nurse to do both child welfare work and bedside visiting, since to have one nurse for child welfare alone would mean much wasted time in traveling.

Miss Boswell also said that child welfare work required time. The visit at the home she said could not be hurried, for the nurse had gone there for a definite purpose and must accomplish that purpose. Miss Boswell felt that the present staff, although giving excellent service, was not adequate to the task of caring properly for the nursing service and child welfare work. She stressed the fact that health was the first essential and that the care the baby received would make the difference between a healthy man or woman and one who must suffer all ways from physical handicap. She felt there should be adequate support to maintain adequate nursing service.
