LEJEUNE HOLDS THROW RECORD



Cincinnati, O., Oct. 25.—It was on Oct. 15, 1872, that John Hatfield threw a regulation baseball 400 feet 7 1/2 inches in Brooklyn.

The great throw was expected to become an ex-record when Garry Herrmann headed the baseball field program at Cincinnati Sept. 11, 1907, but the best heave by Sheldon Lejeune fell short, being 399 feet 10 3/4 inches.

KING ALFONSO CLUB MEMBER

Eastern Yacht Club Recognize Efforts of Spanish Monarch on Behalf of Sport-Finns Cups Donated.

Boston, Mass., Oct. 25.—Besides making King Alfonso XIII., of Spain, the fourth honorary member, the Eastern Yacht Club at its fall meeting tonight, received the deeds of gift of five valuable cups offered for preliminary and supplementary races to the annual July cruise.

The placing of the name of the king of Spain beside that of President Taft, the German emperor and Theodore Roosevelt, was with the desire to officially recognize the efforts of King Alfonso in encouraging yachting, especially in the sander seas, with American yachts in Spain in 1907 and in this country this summer.

All the five cups are covered by deeds of gift that provide that they shall become the property of the yacht owner winning them three times, but not with any particular yacht. The trophies are open, not only to club yachts but to those yacht owners of other clubs who may be invited to participate by the commodore.
