

BRITISH FOLLOW UP THE SUCCESSSES OF SUNDAY

Captured Support Trench Behind Hindenburg Line Yesterday and Repel Several Counter-Attacks—French Also Take Trench Line.

London, May 21.—British troops during last evening captured a support trench behind the Hindenburg line taken during the morning. The war office so announced today. The text of the statement reads: "Our operations in the Hindenburg line between Bullecourt and Fontaine-l'Évêque were continuing with success during the night. Our troops, who had carried a front trench in the Hindenburg line yesterday morning and had repelled several counter-attacks, renewed the attack in the evening and, after hand-to-hand fighting, captured a support trench also. "Hostile counter-attacks were again beaten off with heavy loss to the enemy, whose troops were engaged in the open by our massed artillery. A large number of the enemy's dead were

found in the captured positions. About 100 prisoners have so far been taken by us in these operations. Two German divisions have been engaged in the fighting in this neighborhood since yesterday morning. "We carried a successful raid last night near Loos. Early this morning an enemy party endeavored to enter our trenches southwest of Messines, but was driven off. "Another French Victory. "Paris, May 21.—Several lines of German trenches in the Champagne near Moronvilliers were captured last night by the French. The war office so announced. The French took eight Hun prisoners. They found the wrecked German shelters filled with dead. The Germans lost heavily in ineffectual counter-attacks.

CONSCRIPTION BILL READY FOR FRIDAY

Not Expected Agricultural Interests Will be Affected Seriously.

Special to The Standard. Ottawa, May 21.—The government's conscription measure will be introduced this week, probably on Friday. The cabinet met all day Saturday working out the details of the bill. While the final draft of the measure has not yet been decided, The Standard's correspondent is able to state that the bill will probably contain the following provisions: "The British system will be carried out as far as conditions in this country will permit. "From 18 to 40, "All males in the Dominion between the ages of 18 to 40 will be compelled to enroll. "Enrollment will be made with local boards created for the purpose. No class will be specifically exempted by the bill, but all selections will be made from the list of enrollments by the

military authorities at Ottawa, due regard being had to military efficiency and to the industrial and economic necessities of the country. "In Britain the first conscription measure specifically exempted agricultural laborers and munition workers. The result was that strikers were avoiding service by registering as being engaged in either one of these capacities, and the system had to be abandoned.

Canada Will Profit.

"The measure to be introduced in Canada will profit by this experience. All enrollments of the local boards will be forwarded to Ottawa and the selection of men will be made by a special board. Appeal from the decisions of this board will be taken to the county court. If, for example, a man be taken who is engaged in an essential industry, such as agriculture or munitions manufacture, he can appeal to the county court and the military authorities would be guided by the decision of the judge. This system is now being worked in Britain with very satisfactory results. "It can also be stated that it is not intended to have local enrollments taken by the national service board. It is the intention to keep the National Service apart from enlistsments for military service. It is not anticipated that conscription will impose a hardship upon agriculture or any other industry. According to figures brought down in the House this morning there are in Canada 58,000 single men without dependents who are not engaged in an essential employment."

What Laverne Says.

Montreal, May 21.—A despatch from Quebec to the Star says: "Being an officer in the militia, I shall be one of the first to be called out. I shall present myself without scrumbling, and be a good soldier, for the government will have spoken and I shall obey. But the whole thing is wrong. Canada is already practically bankrupt through this war, and now she is taking another step toward ruin and annihilation. "Such was the comment made by Col. Armand Laverne to the Star at Quebec regarding the conscription announcement. "I believe in Canada first," he said. "If it came to a question of Canada's interest, I would let that little island which governs us so, just as she would let us go were the allies beaten by Germany, and Canada demanded as a condition in the terms of peace. I would not fight voluntarily except for home defence.

Choquette Opposed.

Quebec, May 21.—Speaking on conscription, Senator Choquette, Liberal, said last night that those who had recognized the principle that when England was at war Canada was also at war could hardly be justified in opposing conscription. For himself, as he had opposed the former, he would oppose the latter also. He thought that the people should be considered on the question either by referendum or general election.

Digby in Favor.

Digby, N. S., May 20.—The government's proposal of selective conscription meets with a warm approval here from both political parties, and the expressed opinion is that the measure might well have been introduced earlier. The Empire's need and urgent call for men to fill the gaps can not be satisfactorily answered by stopping such schemes of conscription.
