Boy Crushed to Death in Elevator and Man Dies in Train from St. John. Montreal, Jan. 17.—Four bodies Harry Bowman, a soldier of Kingston, Ont., was found dead in a lane off Visitation street, and he thought to have died from hemorrhage; Edouard Saint Germain, 18 years of age, was crushed to death in an elevator while at work in a factory on Craig street east; Leonie Hing died on the C. P. R. St. John train as it was coming into Montreal; Rachel Gravel, 62 years of age, died suddenly at 58 LaSalle street, where she was employed as a nurse woman.
