British Ports.  
London, Jan. 18.—Arr. str. Sicilian, St. John.

The Donaldson Line.  
The Donaldson liner Cassandra sails from Liverpool next Saturday for this port with returning fighting men, etc. Passengers, besides mail and general cargo.  
Cargo of Oil.  
The Imperial Oil Company's tanker Royalite entered port yesterday from Halifax with 15,000 gallons of refined oil for the tanks here.  
Coal for C. G. R.  
The steamer Soba of the Dominion Coal Line arrived in port yesterday with a full cargo for the C. G. R. She is lying in the stream.  
Receiving Coal Freight.  
The four-masted schooner E. L. Cooney is nearly finished loading cut lumber at the Pottings wharf for Buenos Ayres, where she will sail in company with the schooner Metegan. The chartered price is \$25 a thousand feet and the Cooney expects to load about 300 so the owners are assured of a most profitable venture.  
Sailed for West Indies.  
The Royal Mail Steam Packet liner Caraque left yesterday afternoon for Bermuda with an exceptionally large passenger list and a large cargo.  
New Three Master.  
The three masted schooner Ella J. Williams, which entered port yesterday, was recently launched at Esterville, N. S., by J. W. Kirkpatrick and is now owned by L.H. Hayes interests. She is an up-to-date vessel in every way and is here to load general cargo for Barbadoes.  
Loads for Antigua.  
The three masted Lucille, now lying at the Market Slip, has been chartered to take lumber to Antigua for calls at Halifax.  
The C. P. O. S. liner Scotia, which sailed from this port yesterday, will put into Halifax where she will load 5,000 barrels of apples.  
Sailed for France.  
The steamer Vera B. Collins sailed late last night for Cotto, France, taking with her as a crew a number of Belgian soldiers who have been serving on Belgian relief ships. The Vera B. Collins is a Yarmouth coaster of 231 tons and is rather a slow and light craft for a mid-winter trans-Atlantic voyage. She has been purchased by the Belgian government and will be used for coastal service along English Channel and European ports. Her registry has been changed from Yarmouth to Antwerp, and she will doubtless undergo a change of name before going into service again.  
Taking Plenty of Grain.  
The R. S. Valgard, Captain Ellis, which entered port Friday in ballast from Barre, France, is taking on a general cargo for Nantes, France. At present she is loading grain, her cargo of which includes 100,000 bushels of wheat, 2,000 tons of seed wheat in bags, and 140,000 bushels of oats.  
The Schooner Huntley.  
The schooner Huntley moved up the Long wharf late yesterday afternoon to load 5,000 gallons of oil. She is expected to sail the latter part of this week.  
Lost Sails.  
The tern schooner Dan Parsons, from New York to St. John with coal has put into Sandy Point, Yarmouth harbor, with sails carried away, hoisting gear over the board, and other damage.  
Aberdeen at Work.  
The D. G. S. Aberdeen arrived at Yarmouth Wednesday from St. John and Thursday went out in the Sound, picked up the Hen and Chickens buoy and brought it to the Kilham wharf, where it will be re-charge. The steamer also has a cargo of coal for the Lercher lightship which she will deliver at the first opportunity.

Line, pulled out from her berth at East Boston, shortly after 1 p. m., Friday, for Liverpool, with 72 passengers, including 58 Red Cross motor mechanics, from Chicago, in charge of Col. H. P. Harding, and 17 Y. M. C. A. workers, from New York. They are going to France and Germany. The steamer carried out a capacity cargo, including more than 100,000 bushels of wheat, 10,500 barrels of apples, besides tobacco, provisions and general merchandise. Shortly after the Bohemian left the White Star Harve also for Liverpool, left Hoosac docks with a full cargo. There may be a friendly race across the Atlantic as they are in the same class and are expected to reach the Mersey in about 10 days.  
Into Halifax Leaking.  
Steamer Tuckahoe, which put into Halifax leaking while going from New York to St. Nazaire, France, was delayed a week repairing. The cargo is undamaged. The Tuckahoe was built in record-breaking time, and was in the coal trade before being placed in the overseas trade.  
Lightship Restored.  
The record is dated among captains of steamers in the southern trade about restoring the lightship on Diamond Shoal, off Cape Hatteras, has apparently had its effect, for it is announced that a lightship will be established on the shoal Jan. 20, to replace the one sunk by a German submarine last summer. Since then the spot has been marked by a gas and whistling buoy, which will be withdrawn.  
Navigators took the matter up when it was reported that the U. S. government had decided to keep the gas and whistling buoy on the station. The character of the new light vessel will be the same as the old one. The lightship's approximate position will be lat 35 05 N, lon 75 18 W.
