### C. P. R. Establishes New Record In **Moving Grain**

Moved East from Winnipeg 1,579 Cars in Twenty-Four Hours.

Montreal, Oct. 26—A world's record in the movement of grain has been reported in advices from Winnipeg to a Montreal grain broker today who was advised that the Canadian Pacific Railway moved east during twenty-four hours 1,579 loaded cars. These cars were split up into 41 trains. They contained between 2,500,000 and 3,000,000 bushels of grain. If the cars were placed in a continuous line without the locomotives attached they would cover a distance of 12 miles.
