New York, Sept. 24.
New Orleans despatches of to-day say it is generally understood that the leaders of the late riots will be indicted, and leading business men assert that if such a course be carried out they will be unable to restrain younger men from violence.

It is stated that the White Leagues last night voted not to submit to any such persecutions.
Kellogg last night telegraphed the Attorney General that if the troops were withdrawn there might be rioting at any moment, and not end till Kellogg and all his people were either killed or driven from the State.

Three war vessels arrived below New Orleans last night.
The White League is said to be spreading through other States.

London, Sept. 25.
Members of the Austrian polar expedition declare explorations in the direction of the North Pole hopeless of satisfactory results, and that reports of the existence of an open Polar Sea are untrue.

New York, Sept. 25.
RAILWAY DISASTERS—KILLED AND WOUNDED.

By a collision of trains, Wednesday night, on the Parkersburg branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, 10 persons were injured. A mail agent was burned to death in a postal car, the contents of which, together with a baggage car, were destroyed, and the trains nearly demolished.

A south bound train of six cars, on the Solon, Rome and Dalton Railroad, went through a bridge, falling sixty feet. The engineer, fireman and several others were killed. Nearly all the passengers were wounded, many dangerously. Among the killed is Wm. Boyd, ex-Judge of the State Supreme Court of Alabama.

OTTAWA, Sept. 24.

Compton's dismissal from the position of Dominion Auditor has been decided on, and Elliot is to be appointed in his stead.

In Toronto, today, the Liberal-Conservative Convention adopted a platform, embracing: Economy in Crown Timber; Public competition for Government contracts; opposing the policy of an Attorney General advising the Lieutenant Governor to reserve judgments on bills passed by legislature; opposing the granting of special privileges to creeds or nationalities; condemning the independence or separation policy, and advocating British connection; condemning the Reciprocity Treaty. Over five hundred delegates were present. Hon. Jos. Skead, of Ottawa, was elected President.

In Montreal, a rumor is afloat that a brother of a Minister in the Dominion Cabinet has been awarded a large contract for dredging without tenders being called, and that the works of the Harbor Commission have been placed at his disposal.

Jodoin, member for Chamblay, "Grit," has been unseated. He will bring on personal charges.
Hon. Alex. Mackenzie has gone to Toronto to consult with Blake and Brown on a most important despatch from the Colonial Secretary, to the effect that England will support British Columbia in the demand for the fulfillment of the terms so far as practicable.
