The town planning conference at Hamilton held its first business session yesterday morning. The report of the resolutions committee was presented. The conference approved of a resolution from Barton township requesting that the Ontario municipal act be so amended that rural municipalities will have the same jurisdiction over the opening and regulation of gravel pits as cities have.

The conference approved.
