HAROLD BOYCE DIES FROM WOUNDS INFLICTED BY MANAGER
 Toronto May 21—Harold Boyce, the second hold-up man in the Agincourt Bank robbery, died at 3.50 this afternoon. He was operated on shortly after 3 o'clock, when the bullet which lodged in the lower portion of the abdomen was removed.

His father and brother arrived from St. Catharines about twenty minutes before the boy expired and were with him at the end, together with a member of the Salvation Army and doctors and nurses of the hospital. Putnam occupied the bed next to the dying man.

The two bandits were shot yesterday by R.M. Leing manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia at Agincourt, when they attempted to rob the bank. Mr. Leing who was hot in the abdomen is very weak, but hopes are held out for his recovery.
