The theory is, that the sand mounds are formed by drift sand thrown up from the bed of the lake during great storms. I know not if this be the case, but there is much to prove this conclusion. Be that as it may, we were all delighted with our visit to the sand banks, and whiled away a few hours gazing at a hot sun shedding its rays not only over Ontario's waters, but over a bit of country, even though of sand, as interesting as would be the sand regions in the vicinity of Berlin, the great German capital, or the northern part of Germany.

At the time of my writing Judge Morrison has been dead but a little over two years. He was not in good health for a few years before his death. He died at his residence Woodlawn, on 6th December, 1885, and was followed to the grave through the avenue of that beautiful country seat by many mourning friends.
