The Honorable Mr. Letellier de St. Just moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Bourinot, That an Humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will be pleased to cause to be laid before this House copy of the letter of resignation of Louis Frenette, Esquire, Postmaster at Rivière Ouelle, with copies of correspondence on the subject, and also copies of all papers and recommendations touching the nomination of his successor.

After Debate,

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That such Members of the Privy Council as are Members of this House, do wait upon His Excellency the Governor General, with the said Address.

The Honorable Mr. Campbell presented to the House a Bill, intituled, "An Act to "extend to the Province of Manitoba, certain of the Criminal Laws, now in force in the "other Provinces of the Dominion."

The said Bill was read for the first time.

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a second time on Thursday next.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day the Bill intituled, "An Act to make further "provision for the Government of the North West Territories," was read a second time. On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Mitchell,

Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House tomorrow.

Then on motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Mitchell,
